

Psychic Carl Hewitt Reads Area Residents And Beyond

"The phone hasn't stopped ringing since that show came on," says Carl Hewitt of Chesterfield. Mr. Hewitt was the featured guest last Monday, for about a half hour, on WFSB TV's New England Journal, hosted by Theresa Brown. Carl reports that since the show, he's been getting calls from all over New England, and just the other day, some people from California, who heard about him through friends, made an appointment to fly in spe-

cially for a private consultation, or "reading" as it is called.

The excitement has also affected his business. He is owner of Hewitt's Hair Styles, a men's and women's shop on Route 85, Chesterfield, just over the East Lyme line.

Carl says he was asked to be on the show as a result of letters from people who had accurate "readings" from him and sent his name to the station because they thought he should reach a wider audience.

The show was conducted as an interview by Theresa Brown and later, the phone lines were left open for questions from the viewers.

Carl told Theresa how he was brought up in the South as a Baptist, and his parents tried to "supress" his psychic gift. Once, when he was three years old, he started crying and telling his mother that Annie, his older married half

sister, was dead. His mother gave him a good spankin for speaking such nonsense. A while later, however, his brother in law came in with the news: Annie was indeed dead.

Carl related how as a child, he many times overheard his parents saying that he was "crazy" for some of the things he said, and might have to be sent to an insane asylum. For a long time, he considered his psychic gift a curse.

"Now though," said Carl, "I know that it's a genuine gift I have. I've been able to help a great many people because of it." Theresa asked Carl how his psychic experiences come to him. "I hear voices, just as clear as I'm hearing yours now," he said. "I also see

visions, clairvoyantly. A lot of people think I can read their minds, but this isn't so.

"Just a few weeks ago, for example, I saw something concerning a great danger around President Ford, and I contacted the FBI and they responded, but, I don't want to reveal on the air what I saw for fear of putting ideas in anyone's head."

Theresa asked Carl whose voices he hears.

"People in the other dimension, the life we all go to when we leave this existence. Call it the etheric world, heaven or what have you."

Carl says he's been investigating these "workings of Spirit" since the age of 23, and

is full of references to such psychic happenings.

"Take the Book of Samuel, for example. Samuel went to a medium (Called "witch" in older versions, but "psychic or medium" in newer Bibles). The voice of Samuel spoke through the medium and told him that tomorrow, Saul and his men would be in the spirit world. They were defeated and killed exactly as prophesied."

Carl describes Jesus as "A very great psychic. He had all the gifts."

One caller wanted to know if the average person could develop psychic awareness, to which Carl replied "Yes." — This same caller also got a laugh when he asked if this ability could help him at the race track.

"Unfortunately," Carl answered, "I can't use this gift for personal gain."

A lady called and asked Carl if he believed in reincarnation of the soul. Carl said at first he didn't, but now he more or less does. To the best of his knowledge, though, we have a choice of whether we want to come back or not. He also mentioned the existence of many other planets, far beyond our ability to make contact with them, — where spirits might build new lives.

Another caller asked whether Carl could transmit any thoughts over hundreds of miles, and if psychic Uri Geller famous for bending metal, was a fake.

On thought transmission, — "Four year ago I was down in Charlotte, N. C. taking a shower, and suddenly I "saw" a lady I knew from Groton, Conn. Her face was bleeding severely. I became alarmed, so I phoned her home. There I learned that she was at that moment in the hospital emergency room, being treated for a severe nosebleed."

On Uri Geller: "The only way I can bend metal is to take two pair of pliers. It's not one of the gifts I have."

Another woman called and challenged Carl on the claim that the Bible refers to mediumship as "the work of the Devil" Carl replied this way:

"What about, for example, such incidents in the Bible as when Jesus met a woman at a well and told her, a perfect stranger, about herself. The woman left amazed. If Jesus did this, was it the work of the Devil?"

"And what about Bishop Pike, who gave up his career as head of the Episcopal Church to study psychic phenomena, after his son, who'd committed suicide appeared to him? And what about Dr. Elizabeth Kubler - Ross, the noted psychiatrist in Chicago, who recently said that she doesn't believe — she knows
